

Hammond Institute PPE Badge

The Hammond Institute PPE badge program is open to all Lindenwood undergraduates, regardless of their major, who have completed or who are completing the prerequisite regular coursework. This coursework, which can be satisfied alongside the badge work, is intended to prepare students with the skills and background to complete the experiential components within the framework of PPE disciplines. Students must have completed successfully a total of six listed courses in the PPE subject areas: two in Philosophy, two in either Political Science or International Relations, and two in Economics. See the PPE courses listed by discipline on the next page.



To earn a PPE badge, a student will first complete two online Intro to PPE courses provided by the Intercollegiate Studies Institute (ISI), and then complete two experiential components with the assistance of the Hammond Institute's PPE faculty:

1. *Introduction to PPE.* Each course takes about 3:45 to complete. The ISI awards badges upon completion, which would be sent to us to verify that the student did the courses. The courses can be found here <https://ppe.isi.org/#feature> and are "How Markets Work" and "Economics and the Pursuit of Happiness."
2. *Experiential components* will be completed under the guidance of the PPE faculty. Students must complete two of the experiential components listed below. These components will create a portfolio attached to the badge that potential employers can see.
 - a. *A policy op-ed* relevant to the PPE program that is submitted for publication. This component will demonstrate the student's research, writing, and logical abilities.
 - b. *A PowerPoint presentation* that analyzes a policy topic relevant to the PPE program. The presentation will include two videos featuring the student explaining the topic (creatively).
 - c. *Organize (with other students) an event* such as a talk or debate on campus that is relevant to the PPE program and is intended for students and/or the wider community. This component will demonstrate organizational and marketing skills, along with the ability to work collaboratively.

Upon completion of all requirements, students will be awarded an electronic Hammond Institute PPE badge that they can insert into their LinkedIn profile or into an electronic academic profile such as Parchment. The badging system Badgr will serve as the means to validate that a student has earned the badge and to convey the requirements of the badge to potential employers and others.

PPE Prerequisite Courses

Complete two from Philosophy, two from either Political Science or International Relations (both must be in the same discipline), and two from Economics (ECON 23020 is required). Note that many of these courses can also be used to fulfill general education and major/minor requirements. No more than one 10000-level course can be chosen from a discipline.
