Session to feature Dr. Anthony Bradley from the King's College – 'Overcriminalization & Mass Incarceration

WHO:

The Hammond Institute for Free Enterprise at Lindenwood University will host its next event of the Liberty & Ethics Center, featuring Dr. Anthony Bradley from the King's College in New York City. Dr. Bradley is a professor of religious studies, chair of the program in Religious and Theological Studies, and director of the Center for the Study of Human Flourishing.

During his presentation at Lindenwood University's Plaster School of Business, Dr. Bradley will highlight his most recent book, Ending Overcriminalization and Mass Incarceration (2018). His focus will be on the subject of "Race and Justice Beyond the New Jim Crow." Dr. Rachel Ferguson, professor of managerial philosophy, and director of the Liberty & Ethics Center, will serve as event moderator. Members of the local community, faculty, staff, and students will have an opportunity to participate in this free session open to the general public.
